Read and follow all directions and warnings before using this device. Do not operate this device without first reading and understanding this user manual. Damage, injury or even death may result from improper use of this device or not following directions and warnings. This device is intended for use under the supervision of trained and licensed healthcare or senior care providers in normal, indoor conditions.

This device may not be appropriate for all individuals. A licensed healthcare professional should determine medical appropriateness on an individual basis. Check all parts for shipping damages before using. In case of damage, DO NOT use the equipment. Contact the Direct Supply Equipment and Furnishings for further instructions.

△ **WARNING:** Do not modify, remove or disable any feature, part or function of this wheelchair beyond the instructions in this manual. Do not use parts or accessories that are not designed for this device.

★ WARNING: The combined weight of the user and any accessories mounted to the device must not exceed the weight capacity of this wheelchair. The weight capacity is 350 lbs.

△ **WARNING:** Use extreme caution on any incline or decline. Proceed slowly to ensure a safe ascent or descent.

△ WARNING: Never operate the device on public streets and roadways. Do not allow residents to operate this device unattended.

 \triangle **WARNING:** Never operate this device in rain, snow, salt, mist/spray conditions or on icy/slippery surfaces.

▲ **WARNING:** Make wide turns around corners. Always approach corners slowly, and do not allow residents to negotiate corners without assistance.

★ WARNING: Do not use this device on any potentially hazardous incline or decline (i.e. areas covered with snow, ice, cut grass or wet leaves).

△ WARNING: Do not allow more than one person to ride this wheelchair at a time.

△ WARNING: Do not assist or allow residents to travel down an incline backward.

△ WARNING: Use care when negotiating raised obstacles. It is not recommended to try to navigate obstacles higher than 2".

△ WARNING: Do not use this wheelchair on steps or escalators. Always use an elevator.

△ WARNING: Do not attempt to pick up the wheelchair while it is occupied by a resident.

△ WARNING: Do not allow a resident to bend, lean or reach for objects while using this device. This may increase the likelihood of tipping and falling.

△ WARNING: Make sure the resident's hands, clothing and all other objects are clear of the wheels while the wheelchair is in motion.

▲ **WARNING:** Do not allow residents to transfer into or out of a wheelchair without assistance. Ensure residents do not put all of their weight on the wheelchair armrests, and do not use the armrests for weight-bearing purposes.

△ **WARNING**: Ensure anti-tippers are always installed in the correct position when using the wheelchair.

△ WARNING: NEVER lift the wheelchair by the armrests or front rigging.

△ **WARNING:** Any change of seat depth may require repositioning of the rear wheels. Always test the stability of the chair before use.

WARNING: NEVER stand on the footplates during transfers into and out of the wheelchair.

△ WARNING: Ensure wheel locks are fully engaged while stopped on any incline/decline and while resident is transferring into and out of the wheelchair.

△ WARNING: NEVER tilt the wheelchair on two wheels without assistance. When in any tilt or recline position, this chair must be operated by an attendant.

△ WARNING: NEVER use the wheel locks to stop a moving wheelchair.

△ WARNING: This device is not intended for motor vehicle use. Do not allow anyone to remain seated in the device while traveling in a motor vehicle. Do not use any kind of wheelchair tie-down restraints that are not approved by regulations.

CAUTION: This device is designed primarily for indoor use. Do not use on rough surfaces.

CAUTION: Do not attempt to lift or move the wheelchair by any of its removable parts, including the armrests, seat and front riggings. Do not attempt to pick up the wheelchair while the seat is occupied.

CAUTION: Use care when operating the wheel locks. Possible pinch points created during operation.



Operating Instructions

Flip-Up Armrests

Engaging and Disengaging Armrest:

- 1. To engage, push armrest into arm socket until release lever (A) is engaged into slot.
- 2. For flip-up, push and hold release lever (A) while lifting armrest from arm socket.

Arm Height Adjustment:

- 1. Loosen knob (B).
- 2. Lift armrest until desired position is acquired (range is 9½" to 14" in ½" increments).
- 3. "Retighten" knob (B).




Attaching Footrests:

1. Position swingaway legrest tabs onto pins (A), ensuring footplate is facing inward.

Footplate Adjustment:

- 1. Remove footrest bracket bolt (B). Slide footrest extension tube up or down to desired height.
- 2. "Retighten" bolt.



Back Canes


Back Angle Adjustment:


Manufacturer's setting is 90 degrees, with each hole representing 7-degree increments (holes range from 83 degrees to 111 degrees).


- 1. Remove nut and bolt (A) on both sides of the back post.
- 2. Move back cane to desired angle and replace nuts and bolts (A) making sure coved spacers are in place.

Folding Down Back for Transport:

- 1. Push up the knob (B) on the left side to disengage pin in the locked position.
- 2. Push and hold up the knob on the right side to release back post forward.
- 3. To return back to an upright position, lift up back posts, ensuring right side locks into place and pulling left knob out and down.








Rear Wheel

Rear Wheel Positioning:

- 1. To adjust wheelbase to maintain stability when altering seating system, remove rear wheel from axle plate and reinstall bushing in desired location (A).
- 2. Replace axle and nut and tighten, ensuring wheel spins freely without excessive lateral movement.

Wheel Lock Adjustment

- 1. Loosen both bolts attaching wheel lock assembly
- 2. Slide assembly along frame until wheel lock secures rear wheel firmly in the locked position.
- 3. "Retighten" bolts.
- 4. Repeat steps 1 to 3 for other side.



Transporting the Wheelchair

- 1. Remove the seating system (seat cushion, backrest, headrest).
- 2. Turn the anti-tippers to the upward position.
- 3. Remove the front rigging (footrests or elevating legrests).
- 4. Remove the armrests.
- 5. Remove rear wheels (if necessary).
- 6. Fold down back canes.

Securing Wheelchair with Tie-Down Points:

NOTE: The wheelchair may be equipped with four (4) tie-down points for the purpose of securing the unoccupied wheelchair during motor vehicle transport.

- 1. Always secure the wheelchair in a forward-facing position in the vehicle.
- 2. Attach the four tie-down straps only to designated points on the wheelchair frame.
- 3. Tighten the straps to sufficiently remove all slack.
- 4. Never attach tie-downs to adjustable, moving or removable parts of the wheelchair, such as armrests, front riggings and wheels.

A WARNING: Do not allow anyone to remain seated in the device while traveling in a motor vehicle.

Transfers

A WARNING: Use caution and make sure the wheelchair is stable during transfers.

△ WARNING: Do not use the armrests, wheel locks or front riggings for weight-bearing purposes during transfers. The armrests can be removed by pulling up on them if needed. The front riggings can be removed by releasing the trigger then pulling up the front rigging.

- 1. Ensure both wheel locks on your wheelchair are engaged.
- 2. If necessary, remove or flip up one or both armrests.
- 3. Move the legrests aside.
- 4. Reduce the distance between the resident's wheelchair and the place to which the resident is being transferred.
- 5. Always follow all policies set by your community for transfers.



Care & Maintenance

Technical Specifications and **Customer Service**

Your Panacea® Tilt-in-Space Wheelchair requires routine maintenance checks. If assistance is required, contact Direct Supply. Preventive maintenance is very important. Following the maintenance checks in this section may help prolong the usable life of your wheelchair. Verify the device is correctly functioning prior to each use. NEVER USE THIS DEVICE IF YOU SUSPECT IT MAY BE DAMAGED OR OTHERWISE OPERATING INCORRECTLY.

Regular Inspections

- Check the seat for any visible damage.
- Check for loose or missing screws, nuts and bolts. Replace or tighten as necessary.
- Check the tires and casters for uneven wear, holes or tire/rim separation. Replace as necessary.
- Check the hand rims. Make sure they are fastened securely to the wheels. Tighten as necessary.
- Check the wheel locks. Make adjustments to the wheel locks to coincide with tire wear.
- Check the anti-tip wheels for wear or damage.
- Inspect gas cylinders for leaks or wear. Replace as necessary
- Inspect all cables and ensure they are free from kinks and operate freely. Replace as necessary.
- Verify smooth tilt function.
- Verify fasteners are tight. Tighten any loose connections, if necessary.
- Wash and wax the wheelchair frame to keep it free from excessive dirt and grease that might interfere with the operation of the chair.

Cleaning

- Use a damp cloth and mild, nonabrasive cleanser to clean the plastic and metal parts of your wheelchair. Avoid using devices that may scratch the surface of your wheelchair.
- Wipe off excess water with a dry cloth. Metal parts should be wiped completely dry after cleaning.
- If necessary, clean your device with a disinfectant. Make sure the disinfectant is safe for use before application.

Storage

Your Panacea® Tilt-in-Space Wheelchair should be stored in a dry place, free from temperature extremes. Avoid prolonged exposure to extreme conditions, such as heat, cold or moisture.

We, Direct Supply Manufacturing, Inc. offer to you, as the original purchaser, a warranty for the Panacea® Tilt-in-Space Wheelchair. Our warranty applies for the limited warranty period stated below. If any product or product part listed below is defective in material or workmanship during the applicable limited warranty period, we will repair or replace it at our cost. Please note that the decision to repair or replace a product or product part will be at our discretion.

Our warranty applies only if the product is properly maintained by the original purchaser for normal, indoor use and does not cover normal wear and tear, modification of the product or damage caused by abuse, improper use, failure to maintain, use which exceeds the published product limitations or the combination of any product with another product. In addition, our warranty does not cover fading, colorfastness, stains, spills or exposure to chemicals, odors, heat or light. In certain cases, we may provide you repair or adjustment instructions and/or replacement parts and ask you to perform a repair or adjustment or replace a defective part.

Our warranty gives you specific legal rights, and you may also have other rights, which vary from state to state. Please note that our limited warranty period begins when we ship the product to you. The limited warranty period and our obligations under the warranty end once you transfer the product to someone else or at the end of the applicable limited warranty period identified below, whichever is earlier.
